Who is IRPA?

International association of individual RP practitioners working together through national or regional associations (Associate Societies).

50 Associate Societies representing 53 countries with almost 18,000 members.

Value and strength of IRPA: Enormous resources of practical knowledge and experience in radiation protection



IRPA and Associate Societies

IRPA Vision

International voice of radiation protection profession

Enhancement of radiation protection culture and practice worldwide.

Emphasis on public understanding of risk



IRPA and Associate Societies

IRPA is not a scientific organization itself

but

IRPA has an important function in communication on scientific effects in radiation protection.

Global understanding of risks and acceptance of radiation protection principles

Justification
Optimization

Enhancing Public Understanding

IRPA & Associate Society Responsibility:

- Importance of Communicating with the Public:
 - Clear societal values
 - Emphasis on public understanding of risk
- Public Understanding
 - Background radiation, e.g. radon
 - Medical radiation issues, e.g. CT
 - Nuclear waste disposal, e.g. dry cask storage
 - Impact of nuclear disasters, e.g.Fukushima



Why IRPA Can Be Trusted

Independent Association of Radiation Protection Practitioners

- Fosters radiation protection practices
- Not funded by government
- Not a regulator
- Does not promote use of radiation
- Understands benefits vs. risks
- Adresses concerns
- Promotes public understanding
